

Voter Registration Assistant

Would you like to help folks exercise their right to vote?

- Ministry: The Voter Registration Assistant works with EECM's Council of Congregations project meant to assist EECM clients with voter registration and the new voter ID requirements. The idea is to staff a table at the Food Pantry in ELPC with a volunteer who, while clients are waiting for their food, could offer to help them register to vote and suggest ways to get the ID that the state now requires voters to present.
- Commitment: Spend about 90 minutes one day in this activity during the week of Sept 10-14 or 17-21 on Monday-Friday starting at 10 am or 1:30 pm.
- Skills needed: Able to talk with others and assist them to fill out a form. Answer questions using the information provided to you.

With changes to voting laws it is even more important to ensure equal access to all potential voters – this role plays an important, nonpartisan part in this process. More than simply a day of the week, Sabbath can be a "revolutionary tool for cultivating those precious human qualities that grow only in time." Qualities of compassion, loving kindness, gratitude, and delight.

How can we find time in our hectic lives to pause and experience what is beautiful, sacred, and true? On retreat, Muller helps us cherish the simple gifts we have right now, often missed while we are busy making plans. Weaving humility and passion, wisdom and humor, he gently guides us towards the quiet center where our true nature lies.
