Charles-Marie Widor was born in Lyon, France on February 21, 1944. In 1870, at the age of 26, Widor was appointed temporary organist of Saint-Sulpice in Paris, a post he held for 64 years, having never been given the official title of titular! Premiered by the composer during a recital at the Trocadéro on Saturday, August 24, 1878, Widor's sixth symphony for organ showcases both the organ and organist and, next to the famous Toccata from the fifth symphony, has become one of his more popular

organ compositions.
