TIME OF SILENT REFLECTION

Franz Schubert (1797-1828) composed his Piano Sonata in A Major in the summer of 1819. It is sometimes called the Little A Major Sonata to distinguish it from a much larger work in the same key composed in 1828.

In the end, the blind saw but some of those with good sight remained blind.




