

ON THIS DAY IN HISTORY: English physician Edward Jenner administered the first vaccination against smallpox (1796); Mrs. Gail Borden developed a process for making condensed milk, later to become Borden Company (1852); the first Olympic games hosted by the United States opened in St. Louis, Missouri (1904); the Women's Army Corps was established (1942); and a mob attacked and burnt a bus of Freedom Riders in Anniston, Alabama (1961).

Arthur Foote (1853-1937) was a composer and organist at First Unitarian Church in Boston. Along with John Knowles Paine, he was a founder of the American Guild of Organists.
