CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

If you walk around the Ground Floor or Second Floor of our church, you can see that construction work is well underway now. Current work is focused on two main areas and one secondary area. Primary work is happening around the Whitfield St church entrance and up on the Second Floor, including demolition/renovation work in the bathrooms, flooring removal

in many of the classrooms, removal of the stage area in Room 234, and some necessary asbestos remediation.

Secondary work continues on the Third Floor regarding some duct work needed to supply air-conditioning/air improvements on the floor below it.

The current schedule is to have the bulk of work done on these two floors by the beginning of September, with work on the First Floor to commence thereafter.
