Today is the birthday of Friedrich Nietzsche (1844), the incorporation of the first electric company - Edison Electric (1878), and the dedication of the Cologne Cathedral, after 600 years of construction (1880). Also on this date, one of the first pieces of jazz music written down, New Orleans Blues, was recorded by Jelly Roll Morton (1902), and

the basis for national "Coming Out Day" (1979).

yesterday marked the 28th anniversary of the National March for Lesbian and Gay Rights,

in G Major, BWV 541 shows the influence on Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750) from Antonio Vivaldi (1678-1741). Composed in Weimar around 1715, this is one of the few works for which a "clean" copy of the manuscript exists. Bach's son, Wilhelm Friedemann (1710-1784), used this copy in 1733 for an audition at St. Sophia's Church in Dresden. He


