Bruce Neswick's Partita on Winchester New is based on the hymn tune of the same name. The tune is found twice in our Glory to God hymnal, #42, 96. The partita was composed in 2000 for the 90th anniversary of the District of Columbia Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.

Charles Wesley's

(1707-1788) hymn *Lo!* He Comes with Clouds Descending was published in Hymns of Intercession for all Mankind (1758). John Wesley (1703-1791) attributed the tune HELMSLEY to composer Thomas Olivers (1725-1799) for use with his brother's text, but the melody is believed to have been originally composed by Thomas Arne (1710-1788).
