Maurice Duruflé (1902-1986) was a meticulous composer, constantly revising his music, which resulted in a smaller output of compositions than many of his contemporaries. This perfectionism resulted in pieces of the highest quality, which are held in high regard in the organ literature. His shortest composition for the organ, this prelude was composed in 1962 and is based on the Gregorian plainsong sung at the introit on

Epiphany.

ON THIS DAY IN HISTORY: Athanasius, bishop of Alexandria, established the authoritative list of the canon of the Old and New Testaments for his Lenten letter (367); under the new constitution, George Washington was elected president of the United States (1789); the 26-year old George Gershwin completed his Rhapsody in Blue (1924); contralto Marian Anderson debuted at the Metropolitan Opera in NYC as the first African American to sing there (1967).

Felix Mendelssohn Bartholdy (1809-1947) began composing a new oratorio in 1846 that he never finished. His brother Paul gave the title Christus to the movements that had been completed and it was published posthumously as Opus 97. The completed portions were performed for the first time in 1852. There Shall a Star includes Philipp Nicolai's Epiphany chorale, Wie Schön leuchtet der

Morgenstern.
