

ON THIS DAY IN HISTORY: The U.S. House of Representatives convened in New York City for its first meeting, with Frederick Muhlenberg of Pennsylvania elected the first Speaker of the House (1789); born on this day were the following: composer Sergei Rachmaninoff (1873), Dr. Wangari Muta Maathai, the first black woman to win a Nobel Peace Prize (1940), the soap opera General Hospital (1963), and a little electronics company

called "Apple

Computer" (1976).

Charles-Marie Widor was born in Lyon, France on February 21, 1944. In 1870, at the age of 26, Widor was appointed temporary organist of Saint-Sulpice in Paris, a post he held for 64 years, having never been given the official title of titular! Widor's fifth symphony was composed in 1879. The fifth and final movement of the symphony, the famous Toccata, is one of the most recognizable organ compositions and has been featured at numerous royal weddings.
