Violinist and composer Friedrich "Fritz" Kreisler (1875-1962) was born in Vienna. At the height of his performing career, he was performing over 260 concerts in a year. Kreisler attributed many of his compositions to be composed by other earlier composers, as he did with his Praeludium and *Allegro*, but they were actually his own compositions. He revealed this hoax to the music world in 1935.

The text to the Easter hymn Christ the Lord is Risen Today! was written by the famous Methodist hymn writer Charles Wesley - one of over 6000 hymns he composed. The tune name of Llanfair refers to the village in Montgomery County, Wales whose name is the longest word in any language (58 letters long, beginning "Llanfairpwllgwyngyll."). Llanfair itself simply means "the church of St. Mary."

The Gavotte en Rondo from J.S. Bach's (1685-1750) third partita for violin is one of the selections included on the Voyager Golden Records. These records were on board the Voyager spacecraft when it was launched into space in 1977.

The authorship of the three short New Testament letters attributed to John (1 John, 2 John, 3 John) remains a mystery. The author of the latter two letters is called "the elder" while ancient sources often claimed that John the gospel writer also wrote 1 John. Since all three letters appear to date from 100 CE, it is most likely that they were composed by an heir to the apostle John's teachings.
