ON THIS DAY IN HISTORY: St Paul's Cathedral, designed by Sir Christopher Wren was consecrated for use after the previous building was destroyed in the Great Fire of London (1697); Napoleon Bonaparte was crowned Emperor of France in Paris (1804): Manifest Destiny: US President James K. Polk announced to Congress that the United States should aggressively expand into the West (1845); Abolitionist John Brown was hung for murder, treason and conspiring slaves to revolt at Charles Town, VA (1859); the first Model A Ford sold for \$385 (1927); Japanese Marshal Admiral Yamamoto sent his fleet to Pearl Harbor (1941); paleoanthropologist Louis Leakey discovered 1.4 million year old Homo erectus (Olduvai Hominid 9) in Olduvai Gorge, Tanzania (1960): and the World Food Programme suspended critical food aid to more than 1.7 million Syrian refugees in Jordan, Lebanon, Turkey, Iraq and Egypt because of a lack of funds (2014).
