

ON THIS DAY IN HISTORY: Writer Charles Lutwidge Dodson (a.k.a. Lewis Carroll) was born in England (1832); Thomas Edison received a patent for the incandescent lamp (1880); more than 60 nations signed the Outer Space Treaty banning orbiting nuclear weapons (1967); the soprano Leontyne Price debuted at the Metropolitan Opera (1961); and the epic TV mini-series Roots began (1977).

Jean-Joseph Mouret (1682-1738) was a leading composer in France during the Baroque era. The Fanfare-Rondeau is from Mouret's first of two Suites de symphonies and was composed in 1729.
