Margaret Allison Bonds (1913-1972) was one of the first female African American classical composers to gain national recognition during her lifetime. She performed as a piano soloist with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra in 1933, the first African American to ever appear as a soloist with that orchestra. Leontyne Price (b. 1927) commissioned Bonds to arrange He's Got the Whole World in the early 1960s.

ON THIS DAY IN HISTORY: Delegates from four New England colonies met in Boston to form a confederation (1643); Malcolm Little [Malcolm X] was born (1925); Patricia Harris was named the 1st black female ambassador [Luxembourg] (1965); the Soviet Union ratified a treaty with the U.S. and Britain banning nuclear weapons from outer space (1967); and Spike Lee's Do the Right Thing premiered (1989).

When Handel (1685-1759) completed the Hallelujah chorus from his oratorio Messiah, he reportedly said, "I did think I did see all Heaven before me, and the great God Himself seated on His throne, with His company of Angels."


