The parable on humility in Luke 14:7-14 is only found in this gospel. It has faithful advice both for guests and for hosts, so that through this type of genuine hospitality, it is possible for acceptance, mutuality and fellowship to be made real through breaking bread together.

Shall We Gather at the River was composed by American hymn writer and Baptist minister Robert Lowry (1826-1899). Aaron Copland (1900-1990) included the tune in the second set of his Old American Songs, in an arrangement for solo voice. It premiered in 1958 with William Warfield as soloist and Copland at the piano. This morning's anthem is an adaptation for SATB chorus of Copland's original.


