

Composer John Gardner (1917-2011) was born in Manchester, England and educated at Exeter College, Oxford. In 1956 he joined the faculty of the Royal Academy of Music. His Five Hymns in Popular Style were commissioned for a music festival in Farnham and premiered on May 14, 1963. Fight the Good Fight is the fifth setting in this collection. The text, inspired by I Timothy 6:12, was written by the Rev. John Samuel Bewley Monsell (1811-1875) and first appeared in print in 1863.
