The origin of All Saints'

Day is difficult to trace precisely. The November 1 date of celebration occurred under the reign of Pope Gregory III who dedicated a chapel in St. Peter's Rome on November 1 in honor of all saints. In 837 Pope Gregory IV ordered its general observance. It is a day when the Christian church remembers the life and witness of all the saints of the church those known and unknown - who have attained heaven.

Andrew Lloyd Webber wrote his *Requiem* in 1984 in memory of his father, organist and composer William Lloyd Webber. The beautiful *Pie Jesu* movement is a duet that combines the *Pie Jesu* with the *Agnus Dei* text, which is not set as a separate movement as in many *Requiem* mass settings.

The Stewardship theme is "Follow as God leads." A pledge is an expression of trust that God will provide in the year ahead, and our pledged gifts are part of how our church follows God's lead in our worship, educational, and mission ministries. 


