The origin of All Saints'

Day is difficult to trace precisely. The November 1 date of celebration occurred under the reign of Pope Gregory III who dedicated a chapel in St.

Peter's Rome on

November 1 in honor of all saints. In 837 Pope Gregory IV ordered its general observance. It is a day when the Christian church remembers the life and witness of all the saints of the church – those known and unknown – who have attained heaven.

Andrew Lloyd Webber wrote his *Requiem* in 1984 in memory of his father, organist and composer William Lloyd Webber. The beautiful *Pie Jesu* movement is a duet that combines the *Pie Jesu* with the *Agnus Dei* text, which is not set as a separate movement as in many *Requiem* mass settings.
