William Bolcom (b. 1938) composed 12 Gospel Preludes between 1979-1984, divided into four books of three each. No. 11, Sweet Hour of Prayer, is the second prelude in book four. Bolcom was professor of composition at the University of Michigan from 1973-2008. His compositions and performances have earned him the Pulitzer Prize, the National Medal of Arts, and two Grammy Awards.

BORN ON THIS DAY IN HISTORY: Sister Rosetta Tharpe (Nubin), American gospel and R&B singer, songwriter, and electric guitarist (This Train; Down By the Riverside), was born in Cottom Plant, Arkansas in 1915 (d. 1973); and Fred Rogers, ordained Presbyterian Pastor and American children's TV host (Mr. Roger's Neighborhood), was born in Latrobe, Pennsylvania in 1928 (d. 2003).

The Orthodox Church has a long history in Ukraine that dates back to 998 when the first **Christian Church was** formed in Kyiv. In 1596 there was a split between the Orthodox and Catholics. From 1686 on, the Ukrainian and Russian Orthodox Churches were united until they split in 2018. It was during this 300-plus year period that a rich liturgical choral tradition developed in the Orthodox church. Mikhail Ippolitov-Ivanov (1859-1935) was a leading figure in this tradition in the 19th century. This morning's anthem is dedicated to the Ukrainian people currently suffering the horrors of war and in memory of those who have died.

We've Come This Far by Faith, written by Albert Goodson, traditionally sung in African-American churches, is a triumphant song that makes both a declaration and a promise – a promise for the future based on the declaration of the past faithfulness of God, who has brought us through so much already; and we can be assured that God will continue to do so.


