On this day in history, by act of Congress the number of Supreme Court justices was raised from seven to nine (1869); Frances Perkins, the first woman cabinet member, was born (1880); the liner Titanic sailed on her maiden voyage (1912); tennis great Arthur Ashe is born (1943); the Brooklyn Dodgers bought the contract of Jackie Robinson, thus integrating Major League Baseball (1947); and the U.S. and Soviet Union joined 70 nations in signing an agreement banning biological warfare (1972).

The hymn tune ELLACOMBE was first published in a chapel hymnal for Duke of Württemberg (located in the present-day German state of Baden-Württemberg) in 1784. Ellacombe is the name of a village in Devonshire, England. In addition to Hosanna, Loud Hosanna (Glory to God hymnal #197) the tune is found in the Glory to God hymnal with two other texts, I Sing the Mighty Power of God (Glory to God hymnal #32) and Come Sing to God (Glory to God hymnal #805).
