Contemporary African-American composer Adolphus Hailstork (b. 1941) is Professor of Music and Composer in Residence at Old Dominion University in Norfolk, VA. Hailstork's compositions have been described as "a crossover hybrid of African-American and

African-American and European-American music." Every Time I Feel the Spirit fits this description, incorporating the syncopated rhythms of the spiritual amidst more traditional harmonies and dissonant chords. Speaking on his use of dissonance in his music, Hailstork said that

he uses it to "create tension and suspend resolution."
