
- Hold a prayer stone, palm cross or prayer beads.

- Come up onto the altar to sit and contemplate at a prayer station.
- Bring forward and lay on the altar steps, any symbol of your gratitude, prayers or an intentions.



The Word/Meditation: John 1:6-8, 19, 23, 25-27 (Inclusive Bible)

Then came one named John, sent as an envoy from God, who came as a witness to testify about the Light, so that through his testimony everyone might believe. He himself wasn't the Light; he only came to testify about the Light — the true Light that illumines all humankind.

Now the Temple authorities sent emissaries from Jerusalem — priests and Levites — to talk to John. "What are you?" they asked.

They questioned him further: "If you're not the Messiah or Elijah or the Prophet, then why are you baptizing people?"

John said, "I baptize with water because among you stands someone whom you don't recognize — the One who is to come after me — the strap of whose sandal I am not worthy even to untie."


Quiet Meditation and Reflection (lasting approximately 5-7 minutes)

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
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Prayers of Thanksgiving & Intercession

Prayer over the Anointing Oil (in unison)


