

Music Notes....

The offertory anthem is a setting of Wondrous Love by Alice Parker (1925-2023) and Robert Shaw (1916-1999). Shaw and Parker collaborated many times to produce arrangements of folksongs, hymns and spirituals that have become standards in the choral repertoire. Alice Parker was a renowned composer, conductor, and teacher who died this past December at the age of 98.

Woman Composer Sunday was launched in 2021 by the Royal College of Organists (UK) and the Society of Women Organists. Since then, the Sunday closest to International Women's Day (March 8) has been observed as Women Composer Sunday by professional organizations around the world, including the American Guild of Organists.
