






- Hold a prayer stone, palm cross or prayer beads.

- Light a candle in prayer for another.


May you awaken to the restful and restorative presence of the Spirit, and may you carry that awareness with you out into the world.

Scripture for Meditation: Isaiah 6:1-8 (Inclusive Bible Translation)

In the year of the death of Uzziah, ruler of Judah, I saw Yhwh seated on a high and lofty judgment seat, in a robe whose train filled the Temple. Seraphs were stationed above; each of them had six wings; with two they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew.


They would cry out to one another, "Holy! Holy! Holy is Yhwh Omnipotent! All the earth is filled with God's glory!" The doorposts and thresholds quaked at the sound of their shouting, and the Temple kept filling with smoke.

Then I said, "Woe is me, I am doomed! I have unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips! And my eyes have seen the Ruler, Yhwh Omnipotent!"

Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding an ember which it had taken with tongs from the altar. The seraph touched my mouth with the ember. "See," it said, "now that this has touched your lips, your corruption is removed, and your sin is pardoned."

Then I heard the voice of the Holy One saying, "Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?" "Here I am," I said, "send me!"

Breath Prayer

Inhale — Holy, holy, holy ...

Exhale — earth is full of glory...

Breath Prayer is an ancient practice that connects short phrases with our breathing, help ground us in this moment, focuses us and refreshes us body, mind, and soul.

On your inhale say or be mindful of the first phrase. On your exhale say or be mindful of the second phrase. You may also carry this with you throughout your week, and let this embodied practice hold you, knowing that many across space and time are breathing and praying with us.






Prayer over the Anointing Oil (in unison)





CLM14 Christ You Are Light

A Brass and Organ Spectacular Friday, May 24 at 7:30 pm

The 13th season of ELPC's *Cathedral Concerts* series wraps up with a special concert featuring The Brass Roots, organist Dr. Edward Alan Moore, and conductor Daniel Nesta Curtis.

The concert will feature the premiere of a new piece for brass ensemble and organ by Pittsburgh composer Nancy Galbraith in honor of the 10-year anniversary of Dr. Ed Moore and The Brass Roots at ELPC called *East Liberty Overture*.
