- Light a candle in prayer for another.


May you awaken to the restful and restorative presence of the Spirit, and may you carry that awareness with you out into the world.

Scripture for Meditation: Mark 10:46-52 (from Inclusive Bible translation)

They came to Jericho. As Jesus was leaving Jericho with the disciples and a large crowd, a blind beggar named Bartimaeus ben-Timaeus, was sitting at the side of the road. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout and to say, "Heir of David, Jesus, have pity on me!"

Many people scolded him and told him to be quiet, but he shouted all the louder, "Heir of David, have pity on me!"

Jesus stopped and said, "Call him here."


So they called the blind man. "Don't be afraid," they said. "Get up; Jesus is calling you." So throwing off his cloak, Bartimaeus jumped up and went to Jesus.

Then Jesus said, "What do you want me to do for you?"

"Rabbuni," the blind man said, "I want to see."

Jesus replied, "Go, your faith has saved you." And immediately Bartimaeus received the gift of sight and began to follow Jesus along the road.

Breath Prayer

Inhale — Lord, Jesus Christ...

Exhale — have mercy on me...

Breath Prayer is an ancient practice that connects short phrases with our breathing, help ground us in this moment, focuses us and refreshes us body, mind, and soul.

On your inhale say or be mindful of the first phrase. On your exhale say or be mindful of the second phrase. You may also carry this with you throughout your week, and let this embodied practice hold you, knowing that many across space and time are breathing and praying with us.




Words from Saints and Ancestors

God encourages us to notice and name our desires, in the same way that Jesus encouraged Bartimaeus to articulate his desire. Recognizing our desires means recognizing God's desires for us. Indeed, naming our desires tells us as much about God as it does ourselves... Expressing these desires brings a greater intimacy with God... Desire is what makes two people create a third person. Desire can be productive, creative, life-sustaining and life-giving... and a key way that God speaks to us.

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
Prayer over the Anointing Oil (in unison)


